ISRO's 'angry bird' takes to the skies-Launched at 4.10 p.m., the satellite is primarily for the Air Force's communication purposes

- GSLV-F11 soared into the evening sky carrying communication satellite GSAT-7A, meant to enhance the communication infrastructure of the Indian Air Force.
- Three key factors had weighed on the minds of the launch team at ISRO
 — the weight of the satellite, changes made to the cryogenic stage and
 the second stage of the vehicle to increase payload capacity, and the
 possibility of a cyclone looming on the coast that finally changed track
 gave anxious moments to the team.
